

## Getting there...

On the Mitcheldean/Cinderford/Coleford Road look out for a small road sign indicating the privately-owned **Great Berry Quarry**. Parking is a small and often full space on the right-hand side, (a popular spot for walkers), when heading away from Cinderford towards and very close to the Lydbrook turning.

A short walk gets you to the non-worked quarry which is essentially below ground level but stays dry most of the year. Walk away from the parking and follow the track, bear to the left away from the open and obvious quarry, do not pass the quarry, and follow the slightly down-hill path to a junction. Take the track that trends left and up-hill into an “S” bend and here, leave the path and push up into the woodland on your right (a small outcrop on your left can be seen when heading into the trees and this will indicate you are going in the correct direction). A large hole in the ground should greet you within a two-minute walk from the “S” bend.

The rock is a little sandy so take care and try not to break it!
